Postsecondary Apprenticeship for Youth (PAY Check)

Student Admission Criteria

- 18-22 years of age with IEP or Section 504 Plan
- Eligible for LRS services
- Applicants must submit a brief description of why they want to complete the PAY Check program and letters of recommendation
- Parents/guardians must support their student to participate in community college, learn community and workrelated skills, accept a paid apprenticeship, and ultimately support their student to reach the outcome of competitive employment in the career of their choice.

What is PAY Check?

The pilot program **Postsecondary Apprenticeship for Youth (PAY Check)** is an innovative collaboration between the LSUHSC-Human Development Center (HDC), Louisiana Rehabilitation Services (LRS), Delgado Community College, Jefferson Parish Public School System, and the University Medical Center (UMC) - New Orleans.

PAY Check is a 3 semester program wherein students participate in courses at Delgado Community College, engage in professional career development activities, learn community and work-related skills, and gain employment experience through paid apprenticeships at the University Medical Center.





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
