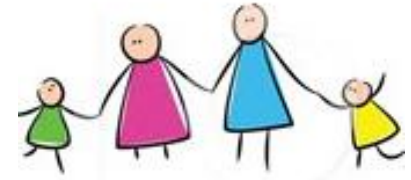

Our focus this year is Family Partnership. Our program is here to serve you and we know it can only get better with your input. We provide many ways for you to be involved in your child's education. Make your voice heard!

Family Engagement

Head Start programs must help parents and families support their children as they enter Early Head Start (EHS), and as they transition from Early Head Start to Head Start, another preschool program, or a child care setting. Early Head Start encourages family involvement and recognizes that parents and families are the strongest supporters and advocates of their children.

As parents and families of Early Head Start children, there are many ways for you to become involved in the program and in your children's educational future. Getting involved at the EHS level will prepare you to be active once your children enter elementary school, middle school, and high school.

Some of the ways you can support your children include:

- attending Early Head Start (EHS) parent meetings and parent conferences;
- volunteering in the classroom or helping with EHS events;
- attending training to learn your rights and responsibilities concerning children's education in school;
- getting involved in decisions about your children's education by learning to communicate with teachers, EHS Coordinators and other EHS staff;
- serving on an Early Head Start committee, such as the Policy Council, Health Services Advisory Council or School Readiness Committee

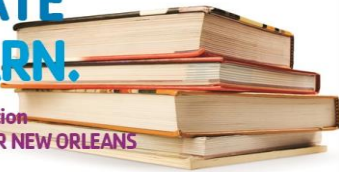

Louisiana has changed Medicaid and LaCHIP to Healthy Louisiana to better serve your healthcare needs.

Who Can Apply?

Any adult who meets the eligibility criteria listed below will be able to enroll in Medicaid under the expansion.

Aged 19 to 64 years old* Has a household income less than 138% of the federal poverty level (see chart below) *Doesn't already qualify for Medicaid or Medicare

Must meet citizenship requirement
